WINTER VACCINES

It's not too late to get your flu and COVID-19 vaccines! Our practices have a limited number of flu vaccines still available to those who are eligible, with some special clinics being run through Winter. You don't have to wait to be invited though - just ask your surgery if you'd like one.

Alternatively, many pharmacies are also able to provide COVID-19 or flu vaccines to those eligible on request. Enquire at your local pharmacy, or use the NHS online booking site. Just search "Book NHS covid vaccine" or "Book NHS flu vaccine".



The majority of the appointments we offer are face-to-face. Between 1st April 2025 and 30st November 2025, over 122,000 face-to-face appointments have been conducted across our four surgeries, including 42,030 in-person GP appointments.

URGENT DENTAL APPOINTMENTS

Extra appointments are now available for people in Dorset who need urgent or unscheduled dental care.

These appointments are for urgent conditions only. While we can't help you register with an NHS dentist, you don't need to be registered with a dentist to access urgent care.

If your issue is not urgent, you may be advised how to care for it at home or guided to contact a dentist for routine care.

LET'S TALK NOROVIRUS!



What is norovirus?

Norovirus, commonly known as the winter vomiting bug (although you can catch it all year round), is a stomach bug that causes vomiting and diarrhoea.

How long does norovirus last?

For most people norovirus is an unpleasant but short-lived illness, with full recovery within two to three days without needing any medicine.

What are the symptoms?

Symptoms include sudden onset of feeling sick and wanting to vomit, projectile vomiting and diarrhoea. It can also include a high temperature, pain in the stomach area and aching limbs.

How long does norovirus last on surfaces?

Norovirus can survive on surfaces for days or weeks, which is one of the main reasons it can spread so easily.

What is the treatment for norovirus?

There is no specific treatment for norovirus. As it's a virus, antibiotics won't affect it. The best thing you can do is get plenty of rest and drink lots of fluids, as vomiting and diarrhoea will cause your body to lose water and salts.
